

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Career Of The Week - Paramedic



What you'll do

Most paramedics work for ambulance services. You'll deal with a range of situations, from minor wounds and substance misuse to serious injuries from fires and major road, rail and industrial accidents.

Your day-to-day tasks could include:

- checking a patient's condition to decide what action to take
- using electric shock equipment (a defibrillator) to resuscitate patients
- carrying out surgical procedures, like inserting a breathing tube
- giving medicines and injections
- dressing wounds and applying supports for broken bones
- delivering babies
- working closely with the police and fire services
- keeping accurate records and checking equipment

Working hours and environment

You'll usually work 37.5 hours a week on shifts, including nights, weekends and bank holidays.

You'll wear a uniform including protective clothing.

You'll work on an ambulance, or as a specialist you may work on your own, using a car, motorbike or bicycle.

The job is physically and emotionally demanding, and it can be stressful. You'll have to work efficiently in noisy environments, make big decisions on your own, and be comfortable with the possibility that an error could have big consequences.

Career path and progression

With around 3 years' experience, you could become a team leader or a specialist paramedic or emergency care practitioner.

You could also move into operations management, education and training, research or human resources.

Skills required

You'll need:

- excellent driving skills
- the ability to think and act quickly under pressure
- practical skills and the ability to follow procedures
- excellent communication skills
- a caring, helpful attitude
- to be accountable for your decisions
- emotional resilience
- balance, to help you 'switch off' when you finish work
- technical skills, to use specialist equipment

Entry requirements

You'll usually need:

- foundation degree, diploma, or degree in paramedic science or paramedic practice
- to be registered with the relevant professional body in your country (like the Health and Care Professions Council in the UK, or the Australian Health Practitioner Regulation Agency)
- a driving licence
- to pass a medical check
- a background check (usually arranged by the employer)

You could start as a student paramedic, a trainee technician, or an emergency care assistant for an ambulance service.

Working as a volunteer with an ambulance trust may help you to get onto a training course.





Careers in Engineering



Are you considering a career in engineering?
