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Career Of The Week

Youth worker



What you'll do

Youth workers provide enjoyable, educational and challenging activities to help young people improve their confidence, develop new skills and cope with issues that affect their lives.

They mainly work with people aged 13 to 19. The role varies, but may include:

- organising sports, arts, drama and dance activities
- mentoring young people
- supporting groups such as young carers or those at risk of offending
- developing and running projects that tackle issues like health, bullying or crime
- managing volunteers
- keeping records
- controlling budgets
- fundraising
- networking with other professionals such as social workers, teachers, probation officers and the police.

Working hours and environment

Typical hours: 37 to 39 a week

You could work: evenings/weekends on a rota

Career path and progression

With experience, you could take on a more specialist role in an area like mental health. You could also become a team leader or manager.

Other options are to gain further qualifications and move into social work, teaching, community development or counselling.

Skills required

You'll need:

- excellent verbal communication skills
- sensitivity and understanding
- the ability to work well with others
- customer service skills
- patience and the ability to remain calm in stressful situations
- to be thorough and pay attention to detail
- counselling skills including active listening and a non-judgemental approach
- knowledge of psychology
- to be able to carry out basic tasks on a computer or hand-held device

Entry requirements

You can do a professional youth work qualification, such as a degree that is recognised by the National Youth Agency.

Subjects include:

- youth and community
- community and youth studies
- youth and theology
- informal and community education

If you have a degree in another subject, you can take a postgraduate qualification to give you professional youth worker status.

You'll also need relevant experience to get on to a degree or postgraduate course.



Entry requirements

You'll usually need:

- two to three A-Levels, or equivalent, for a degree
- a degree in any subject for a postgraduate course

You could do a course like a Level 2 or 3 Diploma in Youth Work Practice. This would give you an advantage when you apply for a job as a youth support worker. You would then take further training on the job.

You can complete an intermediate and advanced apprenticeship in youth work.





Free Places for Eligible Students

- Eligible for Free Schools Meals (evidence of eligibility required)
