Our programmes begin in year 12 and run throughout year 13. We welcome applications from care experienced young people, and would encourage you to apply for a place. Please note that we may be able to offer some flexibility around grade entry requirements for care experienced students as we recognise that educational disruption may have impacted results. #### Pathways to Law

For students looking to study law and/or pursue a career in the legal profession

- Activities include law related masterclasses, UCAS application support, including personal statement and LNAT sessions, National Conference, undergraduate shadowing, e-mentoring. Currently, delivery is planned online, but may return to campus-based events if restrictions are eased.
- Students should be within approximately 1 hour of Nottingham, although some flexibility will be offered this year as much provision is virtual

#### Pathways to Medicine

For students interested in studying medicine.

- Activities include medicine related masterclasses, UCAS application support, residential, e-mentoring. Currently, delivery is planned online, but may return to campus-based events if restrictions are eased.
- Students should be within approximately 1 hour of Nottingham, although some flexibility will be offered this year as much provision is virtual.

#### **Ambition Nottingham**

The Ambition Nottingham Post-16 programme is a free two year programme designed to provide students with an insight into university and help them make an informed decision. This programme is open to students from anywhere in the UK. Sessions will include choosing your course and university, personal statements, interview tips, HE finance and accommodation, as well as opportunities to speak to current students.

Most of the events will be online although we may offer on campus events in the future, depending on restrictions. Priority for some sessions will be given to students from backgrounds under-represented in HE and many of these students will be eligible for additional benefits, such as reduced offers and the Nottingham Potential bursary. ## Can your students apply for more the one programme?

Students will only be able to participate in one of the programmes. We recommend that they apply for the programme that is of most interest.

If they apply for a Pathways programme (deadline November) and are not successful in securing a place, they will receive an email inviting them to join the Ambition Nottingham Programme.

We are offering evening webinars in November to support Y12 students considering applying for Veterinary Medicine or Medicine. These sessions would also be suitable for Y13s who would like to ask questions following their application to these subject areas. To sign up visit.


