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From the Head Teacher

Dear Parents and Carers

This half-term is traditionally a very busy period at Toot Hill School, with many important events. We started with our Achievement Evenings on 30th and 31st October for Key Stages 3 and 4, and then during the week beginning 19th November we hold our Year 11 Mock Examinations. During that week, Year 10 will be sitting their first GCSE modules in Mathematics and Science. Formal Assessments for Years 7 and 8 are scheduled for the following week, initiating the long and careful process of re-assessing the tier placement of each pupil for the second half of the academic year. At the end of the month, on Thursday 29th November, we hold our College Open Evening for Year 11 students. Then we are in the run-up to Christmas with the Carol Concert and Christmas Activities Day on Thursday 13th December. The college students will be organising their Tea Party for an infant school and, later on, a Tea Dance for Senior Citizens. And Christmas at Toot Hill would not be complete without the College Panto!

It is important that we maintain and build upon the excellent start that was made by our students to the new academic year in the last half-term. This includes high focus in lessons, sharp movement from one lesson to the next, high standards of personal presentation and a litter-free environment. We once again ask all parents and carers for their support by ensuring that their son or daughter is correctly dressed for school before leaving home and checking that they are completing set homework. Please visit our website to see what homework has been set.

During the last week of the previous half-term we had an OfSTED subject inspection in the PE department. The initial judgement, still awaiting confirmation following moderation, was that the department was Outstanding. This judgement was given for all aspects of Physical Education at Toot Hill School: the quality of teaching and learning; the range of sports offered in both normal and extra-curriculum provision; and the quality of transition arrangements with our feeder primary schools. Great credit must go to all the staff in the PE department for their high levels of professional dedication which have secured this judgement and to the pupils whose behaviour and enthusiasm so impressed the Inspector – well done and thank you!

Finally, we have received verbal indications that our work on Enterprise Education has received recognition from the University of Warwick with an Enterprise in Education Award. Once again, our gratitude goes out to so many staff who have made such an impressive impact on this agenda – Caroline Smith (Enterprise co-ordinator 2003-07); Paul Fenton (Specialist Schools Leader 2003-6); Paul Bowes (Head of Business Studies); Steve Beach and Sarah Lamb (Business & Enterprise Co-ordinators) and most recently Karan Strachan (Specialist Schools Leader from 2006) and Kelly Sweeney (Enterprise Co-ordinator from 2007).

The work we have undertaken on Enterprise Education and in the PE Department are representative of a wide range of outstanding teaching that we are promoting and developing at Toot Hill School. We aim to build upon our many areas of excellence so that we will be recognised as an outstanding school.

CONTACT

Work Experience 2008

Early next term, current Year 10 students will be introduced to the work experience programme for 2008. The process will begin with an assembly where students will learn first hand from current Yr 11 students about the benefits of gaining experience working in an area of employment that interests them. In addition, students will have the opportunity to investigate work experience opportunities available to them in their PSHCE lessons. A list of work placements will be advertised and students will secure placements on a first come, first served basis. There will also be an opportunity for students to find their own work placements if they so wish. If students think this would be their preference, it is advisable that they approach their chosen business as soon as possible and pass on the company's details to me, to ensure all the relevant checks are completed in good time.

Work experience will take place the week before half term in Year 11, from Monday 20th – Friday 24th October 2008. It is important that students start thinking about areas of work that interest them now, so that they have a clear idea of what type of work placement they are looking for in the new year.

There will be a number of new opportunities for students completing work experience in 2008. It's my aim that the majority of students will attend an interview with their placement business prior to October. In addition, some students will be invited to sit a psychometric test at their placement business. Psychometric tests are increasingly being used by businesses to gauge whether candidate's personalities match the ethos and culture of the business. Both experiences are invaluable to students in gaining an insight in to the recruitment process and the world of work. Other new opportunities include a pre-work experience workshop, focusing on how to get the best out of work experience placements. This will take place in the summer term – more details to follow in the new year!

CREATIVE WRITING, Mrs K Need

This is what the pupils say...

"It's about making friends and working with people from other years, sharing ideas then making them come to life on paper."

"When I joined the Creative Writing Academy I didn't know what to expect – I still don't! Random new madness happens every week!"

"In the Creative Writing Academy, I find I have a chance to express myself through my writing, which I don't tend to do outside of these sessions. The chance to have complete freedom in what you write is not a chance many people have and those that have it, don't always take it. I'm so glad I took a chance on this – I love it."

"I attend the Creative Writing Academy because I get to advance my writing and thinking skills. WRITING IS THINKING IT IS MORE THAN LIVING FOR IT IS BEING CONSCIOUS OF LIVING – to quote Virginia Woolf. Also, joining the Academy is a great achievement, showing that I am the crème-de-la-crème! The trip to Arvon was the best trip I've been on because of the independence we had. Finally, the English Academy is my favourite because of the freedom we are allowed."

Novelist Jeremy Sheldon and poet Chrissie Gittens were on hand throughout the week, with a wonderful guest appearance by popular children's writer Malachy Doyle, to help our Creative Writing group produce an impressive anthology of original writing – this will be on sale soon! The Centre's director Huib said that without question we were the best group they had ever experienced and were a credit to our school; the atmosphere of sheer friendliness, energy and application was superb. As far as we were concerned, the chance to throw off all technological trappings for a week, though daunting, was amazingly liberating; the writing we produced improved astonishingly as the week progressed and all left with a feeling of our lives having changed forever.
