YEAR 7

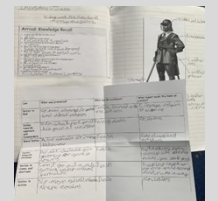
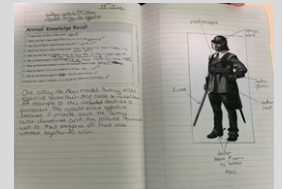
Well done Year 7 on another fantastic week!

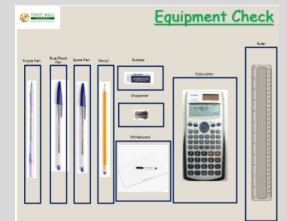
YEAR 8
