YEAR 7

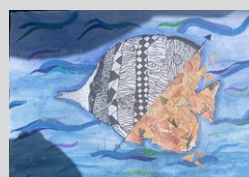

YEAR 9

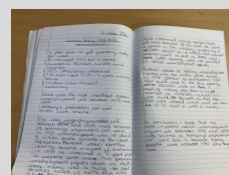
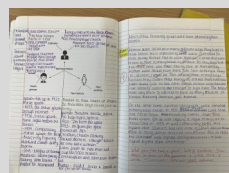
Well done Year 9 for a positive week of learning.
