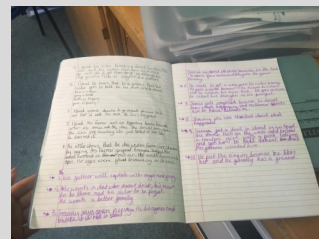

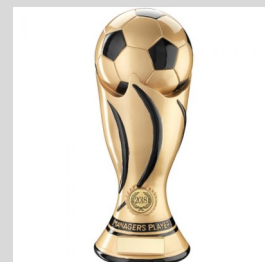
YEAR 9
